

Author Marjorie Spruill to speak at Charleston Museum



Marjorie J. Spruill, Professor of History at the University of South Carolina, is an authority on the American women's rights movement. She has a particular interest in the intersection of ideas about gender and politics. Her first book, *New Women of the New South: The Leaders of the Woman Suffrage Movement in the Southern States*, was companion piece to a PBS special commemorating the 75th anniversary of the ratification of the 19th Amendment to the Constitution.

She will present a public lecture at the Charleston Museum on April 4 about her most recent book, *Divided We Stand: The Battle Over Women's Rights and Family Values That Polarized American Politics*. Her presentation will be preceded by an informal reception, at which refreshments will be served and Dr Spruill's book will be available for purchase and signing.
